Evaluation on the use of the School-based After-school Learning and Support Grant (2014-15)

Four activities were organized using the School-based After-school Learning and Support Grant (2014-15) involving a total of \$28,884:

1. S1 Orientation camp

- > All S1 students took part in the orientation camp on 19 Sept last year.
- ▶ 8 S1 students (1 CSSA + 7 Full-grant) were refunded the \$200 camp fee.
- ➢ Total expenditure: \$1600
- > They enjoyed the activity a lot and developed a strong sense of belonging to the school.
- 2. Art / culture activity (English drama Shakespeare's A Midsummer Night's Dream)
- > 12 students (1 CSSA + 11 Full-grant) went to see the drama on 19 Nov last year.
- They found the drama very interesting although they did not understand entirely what the characters said as no subtitles were provided. Yet they understood the plot perfectly as they could refer to the brochure.
- > The ticket price was \$395 and the service price for each ticket was \$8.
- ➢ Total expenditure: \$4836

3. Art / culture activity (The Phantom of the Opera)

- ▶ 16 students (2 CSSA + 12 Full-grant) went to see the musical on Dec 21 last year.
- They were all impressed by the musical and enjoyed it very much. It increased their exposure to different cultural activities.
- ➢ Total expenditure: \$8048
- \blacktriangleright The ticket price was \$495 and the service price for each ticket was \$8.

4. After-school English speaking courses

- > The service provider hired is called Eureka Language Education Center.
- Both junior and senior courses started on March 11 and end on May 6 (every Wednesday), consisting of 8 sessions with each session lasting 1.5 hrs.
- ▶ Both courses are conducted by a NET teacher and the service fee is \$600 per hour.
- ► Total expenditure: \$14400
- ▶ 16 students (2 CSSA + 11 Full-grant + 3 discretionary places) are taking part in the courses.
- > They have been increasing their confidence in speaking in English.
