

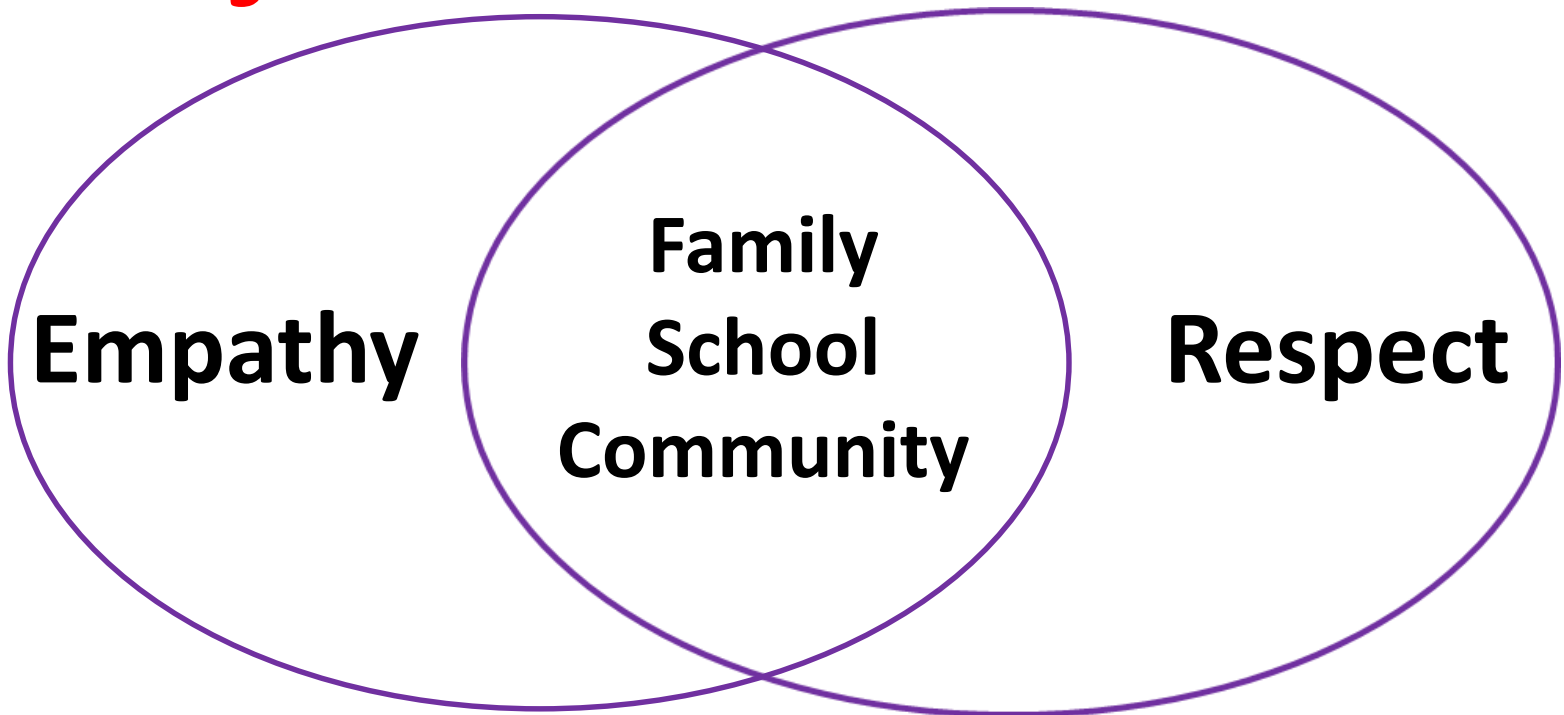

CONCLUSION

THE RESIDENTIAL PROBLEMS OF SHAM SHUI PO

RESEARCH BACKGROUND

Hong Kong has the highest population density in the world. Due to the occurrence of the civil war in Mainland China, a lot of people escaped to Hong Kong and appeared overpopulation. The overpopulation problem is especially serious in Sham Shui Po because of its excellent geographic location. Overpopulation also causes different kinds of problems, such as residential problems, traffic congestion and noise annoyance.

AIMS

- To think about the residential problems of Sham Shui Po.
- To think about the consequences and impacts of residential problems.
- To find some solution to the government in order to improve these problems.
- To raise up the public awareness of the issue.

NEWSPAPER: SCMP

Living conditions for grass-root families in Hong Kong's poorest district have worsened compared with four years ago despite government efforts to alleviate poverty, a survey has found. Residents living in Sham Shui Po in Kowloon were more stressed, inhabiting more cramped conditions and forking out more for ever-increasing rents than in 2012. The group surveyed 300 residents living in subdivided flats, private homes and public housing in the district from last November to December last year. It found that, compared with four years ago, residents there were more stressed about livelihood such as high rents, inadequate social services and quality living expenses.

LANTAU TOMORROW VISION

Background

- The idea was suggested by Chief Executive Leung Chun-ying in 2014.
- He proposed that artificial islands be made in central water for long-term land supply.
- In 2016, the government suggested the development of an East Lantau Metropolis by reclamations in the waters near Kau Yi Chau and the Hai Ling Chau.
- The Task Force on Land Supply adopted the project, in which they listed it as one of the options in the public consultation in 2018.
- During the public consultation, which was led by former Chief Executive Tung Chee-hwa, proposed a research report on 7 August 2018.
- It said that by reclaiming 2,200 hectares in the eastern waters off Lantau in 14 years of time which would house 1.1 million people that would solve HK's land shortage problems.

Research findings data analysis and discussion

- The government said that they used \$500 billion to kick-start the project.
- According to a news article South Morning China post, concern groups state that they could use money (\$1/450 per square feet) to advance private land much more by advancing private land which if it is real would be a whole 300 rugby fields bigger in size than the Vision's proposal though it is practical for large scale projects to have such a high budget, the government can achieve more by advancing private land.
- Another reason to object the Vision is Endangered species.
- If the plan was green-lit, then the shoreline will become closer, more water will become shallow and there will be less space for the dolphins to live.
- Another problem is that the pollution will increase but according to the government, some "environmental experts" have said that the reclamation site is away from the main habitats of the endangered species.
- For now all we can do is take the government's word as it is.
- The vision said that they would make the area mostly for living then the housing issue would be solved but materials and living needs (food, drink, toilets, etc.)
- That would not be a metropolis, just a residential area that has overpriced essential needs.
- Wouldn't the vision make properties worthless, destroying someone's success?

Some people make a living by selling and examining real estates. If it were made then they cannot make a sustainable income. It may sound obvious but most people that fit into this criteria. If that is the case, bank loans may not be a thing due to most people only taking loans for renting or purchasing properties, therefore without the money it earns from loans, banks might have fewer interest rates, or worse, banks might shut down from all the financial burden.

Conclusions

So according to all our findings, Lantau Tomorrow can give HK people more housing estates, and might not too much harm to the environmental habitat. The downside of Lantau Tomorrow Vision is that it would destroy some rich people's success and people may not be willing to live there.

After careful consideration, developing Lantau Island may be the only option so far, as long as it is not overdeveloped, the land we get may be enough to last for quite a while, we think it would be wise to just develop half of the requested land. If push comes to shove, there may already be a better way to solve the housing issue for HK.

Methodology

Problems Facing

- Government intend to take back 32 hectares of the 172-hectare Fanling Golf course after 2023 to build at least 4,600 flats
- More than half of it —> public housing.

Findings

A total of 271 people from different backgrounds participated in the survey which lasted around one month. The results of the surveys were grouped into themes and the dominant themes were identified. The results are summarized below.

Focus Questions 1

Is Fanling Golf Course crucial to the development of golf in Hong Kong?

From the pie chart, we can see that more people agree that Fanling Golf Course is still a place having high value to the development of golf in HK.

Focus Questions 2

Do you think Fanling Golf Course is a place having retained value?

The results obtained above show that the number of people in favor of retaining the Fanling Golf Course is just a little bit more than the number of people opposing it.

Focus Question 3

Do you think the government's plan to develop 32 hectares of the golf course in order to build housing estate is a wise decision?

Why do you think it is not a wise decision?

Response samples:
The decision, which satisfies the only necessities for all players, is in line with their interests.


According to the results obtained we can see that the number of people who agree and disagree are actually quite close. Both sides have strong evidence and arguments to support their point of view. However, the majority think it is a wise decision to develop the golf course to build housing estates.

CONCLUSION

This topic is a sensitive and important issue. It has no right or wrong. As you can see, both sides have strong evidence and arguments to support their point of view. BACKGROUND INFORMATION

- Mushroom Pavilions is a kind of facility in public housing estate (e.g. ShaKok estate)
- Named because it looks like mushroom
- 1 mushroom pavilion is usually rent by more than 1 tenant
- Food is usually cheaper than other restaurants
- Mushroom pavilions' opening hours are usually very long, starting from early in the morning to almost midnight.

DISAPPEARANCE

- The government permitted the company 'Link' to handle the renovation of mushroom pavilions to improve hygiene.
- The company requires tenants to do renovation themselves without providing any subsidy (補貼).
- Very high rent is required to rent the mushroom pavilion
- The mushroom pavilions have to be indoor after renovation, which makes it loses its own style.

No one can afford to continue the restaurant.

STATISTICS

CONCLUSION

Focus questions: What are the problems causing when too many tourists came to Cheung Chau? How do these problems affect local residents or can get benefit from them? What are the ways to solve the problems? Method: Questionnaires. Because we want to collect more stakeholders' opinions.

Research findings, data analysis and discussion:

- 60% local residents think the ferry company can get a small economic advantage.
- 40% local residents think the shop can get the most economic advantage.
- We think about the bigger facts. There is a ferry so we think the ferry company can get the most economic benefit.
- 67% interviewees think the weekends of Cheung Chau are overcrowded.
- 33% think the weekends of Cheung Chau are crowded.
- According to this result, we can observe that the weekends of Cheung Chau are very crowded.

Research findings, data analysis and discussion (continue):

70% think Chinese New Year is the most crowded period. 20% think weekend is the most crowded period. 10% think Ming Festival is the most crowded period.

According to this result, we can observe that apart from the residents think Chinese New Year is crowded, they also think weekends are crowded. And because there is a gap period on the 1st, the people go there in Cheung Chau Festival.

Which part of Cheung Chau does the local residents think is the most crowded?








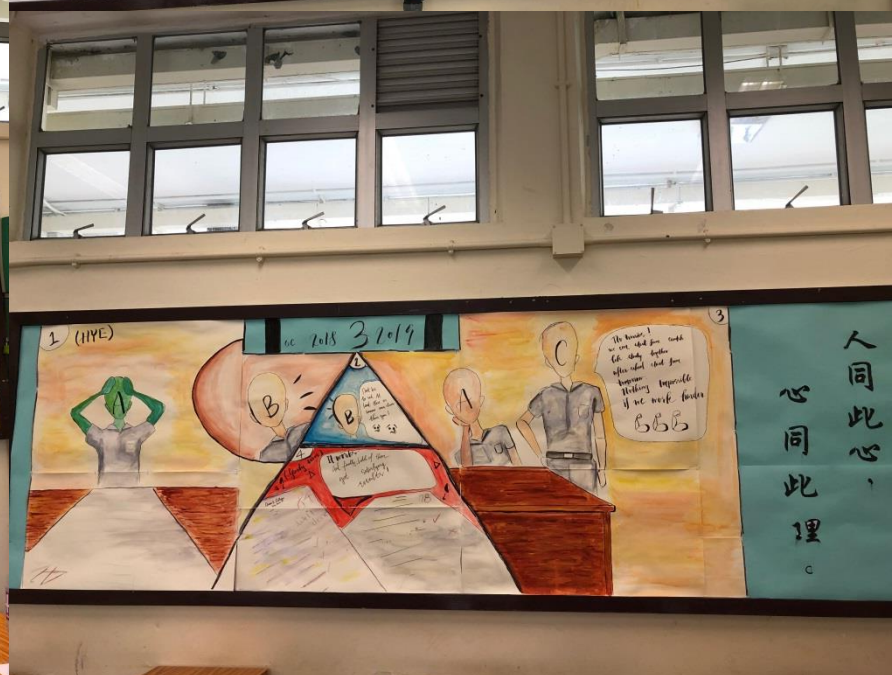

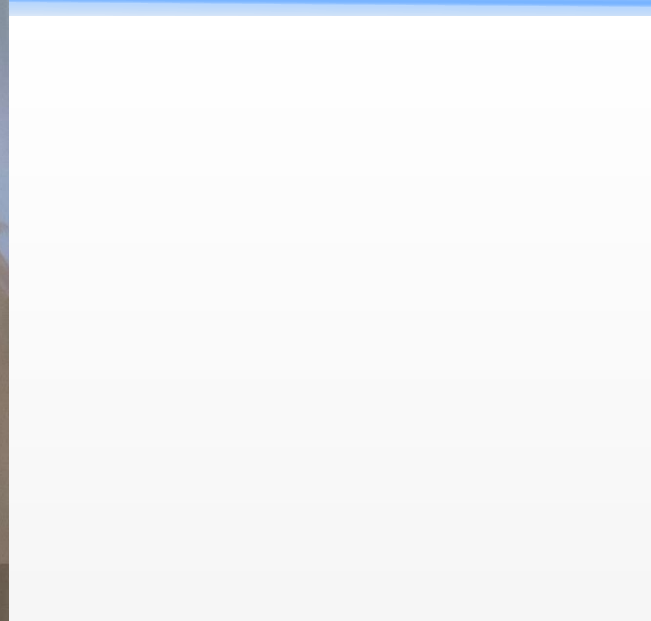
